Important reminders:

- Volunteer parent roles – we ask for your support with at least one volunteer shift per Nipper during the season
- Uniforms should be ordered prior to the season, age group managers (AGM's) will hand these out on day 1 of Nippers; caps will be supplied by the club in the Nippers pack that you can pick up at the Nippers welcome night (or on day 1 of the program).
- We encourage all Nippers to have a wetsuits for the colder sessions, try [Trigger Brothers](#) (discounts for members)
- Swimming assessments must be completed prior to the commencement of the Nippers season; these can be arranged through your swimming club or MSAC

ABOUT LIFESAVING

The primary mission of Victorian Life Saving Clubs is to provide a safe and enjoyable aquatic experience for all visitors to our beaches. Over the summer period (November through to Easter) Life Saving Clubs provide volunteer beach patrols at over 57 Victorian beaches on weekends and public holidays.

Life Saving Clubs train volunteer lifesavers in aquatic rescue and resuscitation techniques as well as offering water safety education to the general beach-going public. Over 47,000 volunteer club members ensure that all visitors to Victoria's patrolled coastal and inland waterways are provided with a safe and enjoyable aquatic experience.

Since the early 1900's Life Saving Clubs have been an integral part of Australia's coastal and inland waterways, providing the iconic 'Swim between the red and yellow flags' patrolled areas. Life Saving Clubs harness the support of local communities and use a network of support services such as Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter, Rescue Water Craft and Marine Search and Rescue boats to ensure the safety of the nation's waterway users.

LIFE SAVING VICTORIA

Life Saving Victoria (est. 2002) is an initiative of the Royal Life Saving Society Australia Victoria Branch (est. 1904) and Surf Life Saving Victoria (est. 1947). Operating as a social enterprise, LSV is an independent company that is limited by guarantee. Life Saving Victoria is a registered charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) and has Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) status with the Australian Taxation Office.

Life Saving Victoria's is forging new lifesaving and water safety initiatives while respecting the proud traditions and programs of Royal Life Saving and Surf Life Saving National organisations.

INTRODUCTION TO NIPPERS

Life Saving Victoria aims to encourage all children to achieve, do their best and develop to their full potential, whilst learning new skills and having fun. We encourage participation in all activities.

The vision for Nippers is to provide a safe and friendly environment where both nippers and parents can learn and enhance their knowledge about lifesaving and to prepare our Nippers to eventually be patrolling members.

There are 12,000+ Nippers here in Victoria. Nippers start learning about surf and inland waterway awareness, and safety through the Nipper Education Program. They are also able to participate in board paddling, swimming, running, wading and other activities and games, that will assist Nippers to become future lifesavers.

Surf awareness and education is a primary aim of the program. Children are taught from the youngest age how to respect and read the surf and to use it to their advantage. This is done in an environment of fun, healthy lifestyle and camaraderie which is unique to lifesaving.

- Increase confidence and skills in beach related activities

What your Nipper will learn

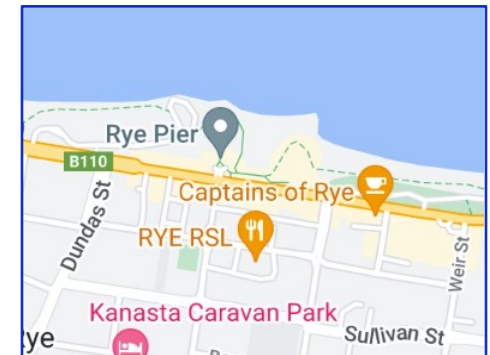
Your Nipper(s) will learn a number of new skills on the beach and in the water, as well as key education areas and water safety.

Nipper Skills

Nipper skills builds progressively on skill development from U8-U13 in beach, water and lifesaving activities. The activities are designed to provide Nippers the skills to be safe around open water and prepare them to complete their Surf Rescue Certificate.

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

All participants that wish to be part of the Nippers Education Program must:

- be a financial club member for the current season
- be 7 – 13 years of age by midnight on 30th September
- stay in designated age group, even if (their) birthday occurs during the season
- complete swimming assessment prior to commencing Nipper activities in the water

Age Groups

A nipper is appointed to a particular age group each season based on their age at midnight on 30th September. For example, a member turns 12 years of age on 30th September, he/she will be registered as U13 for the season.

Age Group	Age by 30 th September	Caps
U9	7 & 8	Green caps
U11	9 & 10	Yellow caps
U13	11 & 12	Orange caps
U14	13	Blue caps

SWIM STANDARDS

Being able to swim competently is an integral part of making children safe at the beach as well as allowing them to actively participate and enjoy lifesaving activities. The Nippers program is not a “learn to swim” program. We strongly encourage you to enrol your children in “learn to swim” classes depending on their current ability.

Swimming evaluations are in place to ensure that Nippers are fit and able to meet the minimum requirements for safety of the Nipper Program. The evaluations consist of a swim and survival float. Life Saving Victoria requires that all Nippers complete a swimming proficiency evaluation prior to commencing Nipper activities in the water.

- Should your child not meet the minimum requirements, they can participate in land based activities only, and we will work with your child to meet the minimum requirements.

We do recognise that swimming in the ocean is a new experience for many children and that even competent pool swimmers can find this challenging at first. Our aim is to encourage children and to help develop their confidence and skills swimming in the ocean as well as provide surf and inland waterway education.

WHAT TO BRING TO EACH SESSION

It is compulsory that Nippers wear their Nipper pink rashie and skull cap during sessions for easy identification. Check that you have the following packed before each session:

- Nipper rashie (pre-ordered)
- Nipper cap (provided by club) – clearly named (on side of cap with waterproof texter)
- Bathers
- Wide brim or bucket style hat or legionnaire style cap
- Goggles (optional)
- Towel
- Sunscreen (SPF 50+ highly recommended)
- Water bottle (filled with water only)
- Wetsuit (optional)
- Blue caps only - Flippers

SUN SMART



We aim to teach children about all aspects of waterways/beach safety, including sun protection. We encourage all participants and spectators to follow these procedures:

- 1. Slip** on sun-protective clothing
- 2. Slop** on SPF30 (or higher) broad-spectrum water-resistant sunscreen at least 20 minutes before going outdoors and re-apply every two hours
- 3. Slap** on a broad-brimmed hat that protects your face, head, neck and ears
- 4. Seek** shade
- 5. Slide** on sunglasses

Remember to think UV not heat, the UV level can be as high on a cold or cloudy day as it is when it is a hot day. The free [SunSmart app](#) tells you when sun protection is recommended for your location and shows the current UV levels.

HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED ?

Nippers cannot run without our parent helpers - no lifesaving knowledge is necessary as you will learn alongside your Nipper. This may include setup and pack down of the beach/activities, becoming a qualified Age Manager, becoming qualified water safety, assisting with particular nipper activities or social functions. We ask that a Nipper parent / guardian assists with **at least one task** during the season.

Please note: a nipper parent/guardian is required to be on the beach at all times, whilst the program is running.

We are actively seeking parent/guardian help with the following tasks:

- Assisting in the setting up of the beach and the carrying down of the equipment each day
- Washing off boards or helping pack up the beach equipment at the end of training
- Assist the Age Group Manager during training (e.g beach activities only)
- Volunteer to help with the BBQ each day (excluding first 2 days of Nippers)
- Assisting Nippers movie night

SAFETY IS OUR NO# 1 PRIORITY

Safety is our first priority for all activities including beach and water activities.

Water Safety

We endorse the [Surf Life Saving Australia Water Safety Policy 1.1](#). We cannot commence any activity unless there is the correct number of water safety officers. To be a water safety officer you need to hold a current Bronze Medallion or Surf Rescue Certificate. This is a great way to become involved with your children and we require all possible assistance. We regularly run courses, so please contact us if you are interested.

Please note that parents are not to accompany swimmers unless they are qualified.

The minimum ratio for water safety for nippers is between one (1) qualified adult to five (5) children or ten (10) children for low risk activities. All water safety officers should wear an orange cap/vest during water activities and must sign the Patrol Log or Water Safety Log Book at the commencement of each nipper session.

SAFETY IN EVERYTHING WE DO

Medical Conditions

The Nippers Coordinator and Age Group Manager must be notified of any medical conditions or special needs on renewal of membership or at the commencement of the nipper education program.

Dangerous Conditions

- Extreme low or extreme high weather temperatures
- High or strong winds
- Rough or dangerous seas
- Any other condition which causes concern for the safe participation of all members

The GSLS Nipper Program will proceed regardless of the inclement conditions. Activities will be modified to take account of conditions and to ensure the safe participation of all members. In the rare event that it is deemed necessary to cancel a programmed nipper session this will be at the discretion of the Nippers coordinator, Water Safety Coordinator &/or the on duty Patrol Captain. In such a case the Nippers Coordinator will advise parents ASAP via email / text.

RESPECT AND CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

Codes of Behaviour

Parents, Caregivers & Spectators' Code of Behaviour

- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment and development
- Encourage children to participate, do not force them
- Focus on the child's efforts
- Encourage children to play according to the rules and settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence
- Never ridicule or yell at a child
- Appreciate good participation by all
- Show appreciation for age managers, volunteers and administrators
- Respect the rights and dignity of others
